Cooperative Learning Research

Research has found that cooperative learning for ELLs:

- Supports interaction and thus the development and use of the first language in ways that support cognitive development and increased second language skills;
- Increases the frequency and variety of second language practice through different types of interaction;
- Provides opportunities to integrate language with content instruction;
- Provides inclusion of a greater variety of curricular materials to stimulate language use as well as concept learning; and
- Provides opportunities for students to act as resources for each other and thereby assume a more active role in learning.
